Year 2 have been studying The Flower by John Light. The text is a thought provoking tale of a world without any flowers or plants, until Brigg discovers a pack of hidden seeds. We started the week retelling the story using a text map. The children were tasked with using actions and intonation to deliver their retelling to the rest of the group. The children loved retelling the tale, so we took cameras to the woods to capture images of the things we could see growing. We loved being photographers and enjoyed sharing snaps back in the classroom with everyone. Afterwards, we wrote question sentences to ask Brigg during a hot seating lesson, showing mature curiosity and intrigue. We can't wait to see where the text takes us next.
