Tooled Up Education

Did you know that small steps taken at home can greatly affect how well your children perform in school? Talk to your children around that dinner table, ask great questions, cultivate their curiosity, read to them, listen to them read and give them as much access to books as possible. Give them a healthy and nutritious breakfast and ensure they have a good night's sleep. These are 'gamechanger' activities that can sow the seeds for great concentration and focus at school and imbue a love of learning in general. Don't worry, we have resources that can guide you.

Parents can model scientific curiosity through everyday activities when 'out and about'. Unlock their thinking by <u>asking great ques-</u> <u>tions</u>, encourage stimulating <u>dinnertime chat</u> and instill an appreciation of the sense of uncertainty that we may feel when <u>exploring new ideas</u>.
